

Please think about signing up for the ETH 700 Ethical Issues in Corporate Life or “Ethics up-close-and-personal.” This course invites graduate students on a journey that begins with their own ethical decision making styles before moving to how ethical dilemmas evolve and play out in the corporate workplace and organizations. Through current research, real-time stories and controversies, students also experience contemporary and classical societal, international, and global business issues, crises, and opportunities. ETH 700 is part of the MBA: Law and Taxation Concentration, and Bentley’s Business Ethics Graduate Certificate program. Five students from ETH 700 have won the Hoffman Ethics Prize in Business Ethics for \$1000 each.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ETH700 ETHICAL ISSUES IN CORPORATE LIFE

Ethical Issues in Corporate Life is a graduate course that explores real-time ethical questions, dilemmas, and issues that leaders, managers, professionals, and students face in every organization and business. The class becomes a community through presentations and sharing at the personal and individual level, continuing to teams, then organizational leadership, and moving to moral issues in societal, international, and global controversies and success stories. Ethical principles, outside speakers, thought provoking dialogue, and contemporary real-time business cases provide insight and content that inform participants’ personal, professional, and organizational ethics.
