FI 402 W01 Investment Practice and Ethics

PREQ: FI 306 or permission of instructor

This is a course for Finance majors that will provide an understanding of the current standards, practices and ethics in the broad area of investments from the perspectives of commercial banking, investment banking and portfolio management. Using a series of case studies, students will apply their understanding and explore the boundaries of ethical behavior in financial institutions. The course incorporates the CFA Institute's *Standards of Practice*, which represents a high level of professional practice in investments.

Students will analyze a variety of current issues related to politics, media and advocacy while gaining direct access to the perspectives of media experts, political players and national influencers. What's in store for the 2018 midterm elections, and how are rallies and protests shaping our political and social landscape? Through this experience, they will gain an insider's view of Washington, D.C., expand their professional network and explore potential career fields.
