March 15 is the deadline for course away transcripts and new students' transfer/advanced standing credit documentation.

 - balancing major classes over junior and senior year, if possible
- Gen Eds/electives

Other things to consider/plan for:

- a potential minor
- taking CDI 301 in the fall
- study abroad experience
- researching Falcon Fast Track or graduate school applications

First Years

Looking ahead to sophomore year, your coursework will include:

- EC 111, EC 112
- GB 213, GB 214, GB 215
- Gen Eds/elective
- major courses, once meeting prerequisites

Other things to consider/plan for:

- taking CDI 201 in the fall
- researching and deciding your major
