



Dawn-Marie Driscoll is an Advisory Board member and former Executive Fellow at the Hoffman Center for Business Ethics at Bentley University in Waltham, MA, one of the nation's leading institutes devoted to the study and practice of business ethics, and she served on the faculty of the national Ethics and Compliance Officer Association.

Ms. Driscoll is an independent director of the DWS mutual funds (\$60 billion), and until 2009 served as independent chairman. Ms. Driscoll is a former director of Sun Capital Advisors Trust (\$8 billion), variable life insurance funds advised by Sun Life Financial. She was elected a member of the Board of Governors of the Investment Company Institute, the national mutual fund association, and served on its audit and executive committees. She served as Chairman of the Directors Committee and on the executive committee of its successor, the national Independent Directors Council. She served as a member of the Advisory Group on Best Practices to Enhance the Effectiveness and Independence of Mutual Fund Directors. Ms. Driscoll was honored by Institutional Investors as the 1999 Mutual Fund Director of the Year and by Strategic Insight as a Visionary of the Modern Mutual Fund Industry in 2011. She was a director of ICI Mutual, and served on its underwriting and executive committees.

Ms. Driscoll was formerly a law partner at Palmer & Dodge in Boston and served for over a decade as Vice President of Corporate Affairs and General Counsel of Filene's, the Boston-based department store chain. Ms. Driscoll has been a chairman, director, trustee and overseer of many civic and business institutions, from Regis College to the Massachusetts Association for Mental Health. She is a senior advisory trustee of the Southwest Florida Community Foundation where she was formerly chairman of the board of trustees.

Among Ms. Driscoll's awards and honors are an honorary Doctor of Arts degree from Regis College, an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from Suffolk University, an honorary Doctor of Commercial Science degree from Bentley University Graduate School of Business, appointment as Visitor-in-Residence at The Bunting Institute at Radcliffe College at Harvard, as a visiting scholar at the University of Montana School of Business and as visiting John L. Aram Professor of Business Ethics at Gonzaga University. She is a graduate of Suffolk University Law School and Regis College.
