TO MAXIMIZE PROFIES. WHEN OUR ECONOMIC SYSTEM

WORKS WELL—AND IT DOES REMARKABLY OFTEN—THE

CONTRIBUTIONS THAT EACH OF US MAKES WITHIN OUR

OWN CORPORATE ENTITY DO ALSO CONTRIBUTE TO THE

PUBLIC INTEREST. BUT I DON'T THINK ANY OF US

WANTS TO BE ONLY AN "ECONOMIC MAN," THINKING

ONLY OF OUR SELF—INTEREST. PUBLIC—PRIVATE

PARTNERSHIPS ALLOW CORPORATE LEADERS AND

EMPLOYEES TO BE "COMMUNITY PEOPLE" AND "CARING

PEOPLE," AS WELL.

I DON'T THINK, HOWEVER, THAT OUR CORPORATE PARTNERSHIP ROLE IS ENTIRELY CLEAR EITHER TO US OR TO OUR PARTNERS. FOR EXAMPLE, AS THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WITHDRAWS ITS SUPPORT FOR SOCIAL SERVICES, MORE AND MORE PEOPLE NOW EXPECT THE CORPORATION TO STEP IN. RECENTLY, THE NEW YORK TIMES REPORTED THAT SEVERAL CORPORATIONS ARE UNDERWRITING CHILD CARE CENTERS. A FEW DAYS LATER, THE DIRECTOR OF AN AGENCY CARING FOR THE ELDERLY WROTE THE TIMES AGREEING THAT CORPORATE DAY CARE "MAKES GOOD ECONOMIC SENSE," AND THEN ADDED THAT IT ALSO MAKES "GOOD ECONOMIC SENSE" FOR CORPORATIONS TO TAKE CARE OF THEIR EMPLOYEE'S AGING PARENTS.

ANOTHER EXAMPLE. IN OUR REGION, THERE'S NOT ENOUGH HOUSING FOR CORPORATE EMPLOYEES. So, OF COURSE, MANY PEOPLE INCLUDING PUBLIC INDIVIDUAL OFFICIALS THINKACORPORATIONS SHOULD BUILD HOUSING.

WHERE DOES IT STOP? WHERE SHOULD IT STOP? OR
SHOULD IT STOP AT ALL? AND CAN THE AD HOC
INFORMAL AGREEMENTS OF PUBLIC-PRIVATE

PARTNERSHIPS KEEP GOING? I HAVE ALWAYS ARGUED

THAT PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS SHOULD NOT

MEAN PRIVATE SECTOR SUBSTITUTION FOR PUBLIC

SECTOR RESPONSIBILITY. BUT WHO DEFINES

ACCEPTABLE MINIMUM LEVELS OF PUBLIC

RESPONSIBILITY OR THE LIMITS AT THE TOP END

OF THE SCALE? AND, WHAT ARE THEY?

So, EVEN THOUGH THE HONEYMOON OF BUSINESS AND GOVERNMENT WORKING TOGETHER FOR THE COMMON SOCIAL GOOD GENERALLY SEEMS TO BE CONTINUING, THAT HONEYMOON IS BOUND TO END, AND WE'LL NEED SOME CLEARER GUIDELINES FOR LONG IT IS AN IMPORTANT LONG TERM ISSUE TO ADDRESS AND GOES BEYOND THE SCOPE OF MY COMMENTS THIS EVENING. HOWEVER, IT OCCURS TO ME THAT PITTSBURGH'S DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITIES COULD JOIN YOUR EXPERIENCE WITH THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF ECONOMICS AND POLITICAL SCIENCE--AND PHILOSOPHY--TO PRODUCE SOME THOUGHTFUL ASSISTANCE ON THESE THORNY ISSUES FROM WHICH WE COULD ALL BENEFIT.

LET ME BEGIN WITH AMERICAN CAN'S PARTNERSHIP WITH MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. HIGH SCHOOL IN AN AN MINORTY SCHOOL MANHATTAN. WE'VE UNDERTAKEN A NUMBER OF PROGRAMS WITH MLKHS, INCLUDING SOME CONCEPTS BORROWED FROM YOUR OWN VERY GOOD EXPERT, DAVID BERGHOLZ. WE HAVE DEVELOPED SMALL GRANT SUPPORT PROGRAMS IN SCHOOL AND AFTER SCHOOL, WITH RIPPLES THAT GO ON AND ON. FOR INSTANCE, WE HELPED TO SET UP A PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB AND SENT A PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER TO WORK WITH THE TEACHER IN CHARGE, Now, THE TEACHER HAS A REGULAR COURSE IN PHOTOGRAPHY AND CONTINUES THE AFTERSCHOOL CLUB. THE SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS WE HAVE HELPED TO START REACH INTO THE COMMUNITY AND HAVE IMPROVED THE SCHOOL'S RELATIONS WITH THE NEIGHBORHOOD.

REACH INTO THE BUSINESS WORLD, TOO, BY HOLDING Join A Scipoc

PROGRAM

OUR ANNUAL SHAREHOLDER'S MEETING IN THE

SCHOOL'S AUDITORIUM IN 1984. ABOUT 350 OF OUR SHAREHOLDERS ATTENDED AND TWO HUNDRED STUDENTS TOOK PART, THE WHOLE SCHOOL--STUDENTS AND TEACHERS, PARENTS AND ADMINISTRATORS--WORKED WITH US TO ORGANIZE THIS EVENT. THERE WERE WELCOMING POSTERS, AND AN ART EXHIBIT THAT'S BECOME A CONTINUING EVENT AT AMERICAN CAN, AND A FILM THE STUDENTS MADE ABOUT LIFE IN THE HIGH SCHOOL. THE STUDENTS ALSO PREPARED A STUDENT VERSION OF THE AMERICAN CAN COMPANY ANNUAL REPORT WHICH WAS EMINENTLY READABLE AND INFORMATIVE.

AMERICAN CAN HELPED TO EXTEND THE SCHOOL'S

MORE RECENTLY, OUR PROGRAM HAS ADDED VOCATIONAL COMPONENTS. ONE PROGRAM PREPARES STUDENTS TO BECOME SECURITY GUARDS. IT HAS BEEN DONE SO WELL AT MARTIN LUTHER KING, WE ARE NOW WORKING WITH THE NATIONAL CRIME PREVENTION COUNCIL, TO TEST ITS FEASIBILITY AS A NATIONAL MODEL. IN TRANSLUL EFFORT, STUDENTS FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL HAVE INTERNED AT AMERICAN CAN ONE DAY A WEEK; SOME WORK FULL-TIME IN SUMMER.

WITH WHAT RESULTS? ATTENDANCE, ACADEMIC

PERFORMANCE, THE NUMBER OF GRADUATES GOING ON

TO HIGHER EDUCATION ARE ALL UP ALTHOUGH IT

WOULD BE PRESUMPTUOUS OF ME TO ATTRIBUTE ALL

THOSE IMPROVEMENTS ONLY TO OUR PARTNERSHIP

EFFORTS. BUT PERHAPS MORE IMPORTANT IS THAT

BEHIND THOSE NUMBERS THERE IS A PERCEPTIBLE

INCREASE IN THE SENSE OF SELF-WORTH AT THE

SCHOOL--NOT JUST AMONG THE PUPILS BUT THE

TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS, TOO.

WE'VE LEARNED SOME THINGS IN OUR PARTNERSHIPS

AS WELL. FIRST, WE FOUND THAT AMERICAN CAN IS

LEARNING AND BENEFITING FROM OUR JOINT

ACTIVITIES AS MUCH AS THE SCHOOL. SO WE CALL

OUR PROGRAM "JOIN-A-SCHOOL" RATHER THAN

"ADOPT-A-SCHOOL." WE DON'T LOOK ON OUR ROLE

AS "IN LOCO PARENTIS." IT'S A JOINT PROGRAM

OF MUTUAL BENEFIT.

THE SECOND LESSON IS THAT THE PROGRAM WORKS

BECAUSE SENIOR EXECUTIVES ARE COMMITTED AND

PERSONALLY INVOLVED. WE TEACH CLASSES; WE

WORK ONE-ON-ONE WITH INTERNS. MONEY CAN MAKE

A GOOD JOIN-A-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP WORK BETTER,

BUT MONEY WITHOUT PERSONAL PARTICIPATION DOES

NOT IN MY OPINION CONSTITUTE A REAL PARTNERSHIP.

THERE'S A LESS HAPPY THIRD LESSON. I WANT TO SPEND SOME TIME ON THAT. GOOD AS IT IS, INVALUABLE AS IT IS, JOIN-A-SCHOOL CAN'T

POSSIBLY MEET THE NEEDS OF AMERICAN SCHOOLS IN

If A LITTLE LIKE PASSIBLE TO COLE CARDESE BY

THE 1980'S, I'M CONVINCED THAT CORPORATE USING LOTS OF

BANDARDS

LEADERS MUST GO BEYOND SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS IN

THEIR SUPPORT FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION. WE SHOULD

RESOURCES FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS, AS IF OUR

COLLECTIVE FUTURE DEPENDED UPON IT--BECAUSE

IT DOES,

SENATOR DANIEL PATRICK MOYNIHAN OF NEW YORK OBSERVED RECENTLY THAT THE UNITED STATES MAY BE THE FIRST SOCIETY IN HISTORY WHERE CHILDREN ARE MUCH WORSE OFF THAN ADULTS. NEARLY 25 PERCENT OF AMERICAN CHILDREN LIVE IN HOUSEHOLDS WITH INCOMES BELOW THE POVERTY LINE, AMONG BLACK CHILDREN, NEARLY HALF OF THOSE UNDER SIX LIVE IN POVERTY, AND IN 23 OF OUR LARGEST 25 SCHOOL SYSTEMS, MINORITY STUDENTS ARE IN THE MAJORITY. STUDENTS WHOSE NATIVE LANGUAGE IS NOT ENGLISH ARE INCREASING; SO IS THE DROP-OUT RATE, ONLY SIX OF EVERY TEN HISPANIC YOUNGSTERS COMPLETE HIGH SCHOOL,

MORE THAN EVER, PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE THE CRITICAL,

AVENUE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR DISADVANTAGED YOUNG

PEOPLE, YET OUR INVESTMENTS IN OUR PUBLIC

SCHOOLS, WHILE FINALLY BEGINNING TO INCREASE

AGAIN, ARE FAR FROM SUFFICIENT. TEACHERS, THE

MOST CRITICAL PART OF THE EDUCATIONAL PROCESS

ARE OVERWORKED, UNDERPAID AND VASTLY UNDER

APPRECIATED. AND MANY SCHOOL BUILDINGS ACROSS

THE COUNTRY ARE IN DISREPAIR, IN SOME CASES

SHOCKINGLY SO.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS NEED MORE THAN MONEY, OF

COURSE, THEY NEED RESPECT; THEY NEED BETTER

LEADERSHIP. THE INSTITUTE FOR EDUCATIONAL

LEADERSHIP, AN ORGANIZATION I FIND TIMELY AND

VALUABLE, JUST RELEASED A REPORT SUGGESTING

WAYS LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS COULD BETTER EXERCISE

LEADERSHIP. THEY MIGHT PAY ATTENTION NOW WHEN

GOVERNORS ARE WAVING THE BIG STICK OF

THREATENED STATE TAKEOVER AT THEM. A LEADERSHIP

SCHOOLS

ISSUES ASIDE, MAKE NO MISTAKE; THEN NEED MORE

MONEY.

COMMERCIALS, THE GREAT SOCIETY PROGRAMS WILL,

I THINK, BE VIEWED IN FAR MORE FAVORABLE TERMS

THAN WE DO TODAY. ALREADY, SOME OF THE EVIDENCE

FOR GREAT SOCIETY TYPE PROGRAMS IS IN:

- -- HEADSTART--A TREMENDOUS DIFFERENCE, IT

 HAS BOOSTED YOUNGSTERS FROM HOMES WITHOUT

 BOOKS INTO THE READING AND WRITING WORLD.
- -- SCHOOL INTEGRATION--NOT ONLY IMPROVED

 CAREERS FOR BLACK STUDENTS BUT MORE

 POSITIVE ETHNIC AND RACIAL HARMONY.

It's up to us, leaders in the several sectors of American Life, to Help Carry the Message that social and Educational PROGRAM INVESTMENTS ARE ESSENTIAL FOR THE

THE SECOND AREA OF PARTNERSHIPS THAT I WANT TO TOUCH UPON THIS EVENING IS THAT OF REGIONAL PLANNING, INCREASINGLY, PEOPLE'S DAY-TO-DAY ACTIVITIES ARE SPREAD THROUGH WIDE AREAS OF THEIR URBAN REGION. THEY WORK IN ONE MUNICIPALITY; THEIR SPOUSE WORKS IN ANOTHER; THEY GO TO CHURCH IN ONE DIRECTION, TO THE MOVIES IN A SECOND, TO A RESTAURANT IN A THIRD, AND THEY SHOP IN SEVERAL DIRECTIONS. YET, AT LEAST IN OUR REGION #, THE NEW YORK METROPOLITAN AREA, PEOPLE ARE BECOMING FIERCELY PAROCHIAL -- PARTICULARLY WITH RESPECT TO DEFENDING THE STATUS QUO WHERE THEIR HOUSE ACTUALLY SITS. IF THEY LIVE IN A POOR NEIGHBORHOOD, RESIDENTS RESIST ANY NEW DEVELOPMENT BECAUSE IT MAY ATTRACT HIGHER INCOME RESIDENTS WHO WILL PRICE THEM OUT. DENTRIPHENTION IS A DIEJY WOED.

IF THEY LIVE IN A HIGH-INCOME NEIGHBORHOOD,

THEY RESIST HOUSING MIDDLE-INCOME RESIDENTS

EVEN IF THEY ARE WELCOMED IN THE OFFICES WHERE

MIDDLE-INCOME PEOPLE WORK, THE RESULT IS

DIFFICULTY IN FILLING, THE LOWER-PAID JOBS # IN LOCAC

SERVICIE INDUSPRIS - EVERY MACDOMINOS & BURGALKING IN

REGIONAL PLAN CALCULATED A FEW YEARS AGO THAT THE AVERAGE TRIP TO WORK IN A CORPORATE HEADQUARTERS, WHETHER IN MANHATTAN OR ON A AND I KNOW AT SUBURBAN CAMPUS, WAS 15-20 MILES EACH WAY, AMERICAN CAN THAT AVG. COMHUTING TIME WITH SUBURBAN HIGHWAYS CONGEALING RAPIDLY. TO GREEDWICH 15 ANOTHER RESULT OF THIS PAROCHIALISM IS A LOUGER PAPER IT WAS WHEN OUR OFFICES CRISIS IN DISPOSING OF SOLID WASTES AND THE WELL ID MID DOWN PROVISION OF MOST FACILITIES THAT EVERYONE THERE IS NO LACK OF MUSIC. NEEDS BUT NOBODY WANTS NEAR THEM, LOGICAL PLAN SO NIMBY CARRIES THE DAY--"NOT IN MY BACK YARD," Wingow, Westpag, Norwark Example

I FREQUENTLY ADDRESS THESE ISSUES OF REGIONAL PLANNING NEEDS TO THE CORPORATE COMMUNITY

BECAUSE WE ARE ONE OF ONLY TWO COMMUNITIES—

THE MEDIA BEING THE OTHER—THAT RECOGNIZE

THERE IS A REGION. OTHERS DON'T SEE IT.

THERE'S NO REGIONAL BOUNDARY ON THE ROAD MAP;

NO ONE RUNS FOR REGIONAL PUBLIC OFFICE.

So, IN OUR REGION, MOST PEOPLE FOCUS ON THE 880 INDEPENDENT MUNICIPALITIES OR THE SIMILAR NUMBER OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS OR PERHAPS THE 31 COUNTIES. BUT THE REGION AS A WHOLE IS THE ECONOMY, SO CORPORATIONS IDENTIFY WITH IT; AND IT'S AN INFORMATION-SHED, SO THE MEDIA--TV, RADIO AND METROPOLITAN NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES--CATER TO IT.

IN FACT, THE ELEMENTS OF OUR REGIONAL ECONOMY ARE BECOMING MORE TIGHTLY INTERWOVEN BECAUSE OF THE NEW KIND OF HOUSEHOLD, WIVES WORKING AND CHILDREN STAYING AT HOME IN THEIR WORKING YEARS MEAN THAT EACH HOUSEHOLD PROBABLY IS LINKED TO AT LEAST TWO AND MAYBE MORE DIFFERENT EMPLOYERS, IT'S VERY HARD, THEN, FOR A FIRM TO MOVE AND TAKE ALONG ITS VALUED EMPLOYEES. FURTHERMORE, THE SHORTAGE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING HAS SENT PEOPLE IN ALL DIRECTIONS IN SEARCH OF IT, REGARDLESS OF WHERE THEIR JOB MIGHT BE LOCATED. SO THERE ARE DISTINCT BENEFITS TO LOCATING OUR BUSINESSES IN THE CENTER OF THE CENTER, THE MANHATTAN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT,

AND OVER LONG DISTANCES BECAUSE THERE ARE

ENOUGH PEOPLE TRAVELLING TO MANHATTAN FROM

EVERY DIRECTION TO SUPPORT FAST EXPRESS BUSES

AND TRAINS.

OFFICE BUILDINGS ARE AROUND THE LOWEST IN THE COUNTRY AND A SWIFT PACE OF OFFICE BUILDING CONTINUES. IN THE 8½ SQUARE MILES SOUTH OF CENTRAL PARK, AN AREA NO BIGGER THAN KENNEDY AIRPORT, NEARLY SIX MILLION SQUARE FEET OF NEW OFFICE SPACE HAS BEEN ADDED EVERY YEAR, ON THE AVERAGE, FOR ABOUT THREE DECADES. WE'VE HAD OUR EMPLOYMENT UPS AND DOWNS, BUT WE'RE

IN JUST THE LAST EIGHT YEARS, THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE ENTERING THE MANHATTAN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT EVERY DAY INCREASED BY ABOUT HALF A MILLION--TO 3,3 MILLION. AND FOR THE FIRST TIME, OFFICE JOBS ARE BEGINNING TO SPILL OVER FROM MANHATTAN TO DOWNTOWNS IN BROOKLYN AND QUEENS AND RIGHT ACROSS THE HUDSON RIVER TO JERSEY CITY AND OTHER WATERFRONT SITES. AT THE SAME TIME, OFFICE SUBCENTERS, LINKED BY RAIL TO MANHATTAN, ARE SPROUTING--STAMFORD, WHITE PLAINS, NEWARK, NEW BRUNSWICK, VERY MUCH THE WAY REGIONAL PLAN ASSOCIATION HAS RECOMMENDED. I MIGHT AND

BUT EVERY SUCCESS BRINGS NEW PROBLEMS, AND CAUTER BUSINESS DISJUICATE CONGESTION ENTERING THE AND MOVING AROUND IN IT ARE BUILDING TOWARD A CRISIS. THERE ARE AT LEAST HALF-HOUR DELAYS EVERY MORNING ENTERING FROM NEW JERSEY BY CAR, AND EVEN

GROWING DELAYS ON THE EXCLUSIVE BUS LANES.

CENTER BUSIDESS DISTRICT

ONCE INTO THE SEED WITH YOUR CAR, REGIONAL PLAN

PROJECTS THAT WITHIN A FEW YEARS, TRAFFIC WILL

BE WHAT IT WAS DURING THE SUBWAY STRIKE--IF

PRESENT TRENDS CONTINUE. PERHAPS YOU CAN'T

SKYROCKETED AND PEOPLE WERE GOING BY RAIL INTO

NEW JERSEY AND BACK TO GET FROM DOWNTOWN TO

MIDTOWN MANHATTAN. REGIONAL PLAN ASSOCIATION

HAS PROPOSED THAT THE SCARCE MANHATTAN STREET

SPACE BE RATIONED BY PRICE; IT MAY TAKE A \$10

DAILY CHARGE TO MODERATE AUTO ENTRIES ENOUGH

TO MEET FEDERAL AIR QUALITY STANDARDS BY THE

DEADLINE AT THE END OF NEXT YEAR. BUT PROBLEMS

OF PROSPERITY ARE THE KIND WE LIKE, AND MORE

AND MORE PEOPLE ARE AT LEAST ACKNOWLEDGING

THAT PROBLEMS AT THE CENTER ARE REGIONAL

PROBLEMS REQUIRING REGIONAL SOLUTIONS.

OUR PROBLEMS IN THE SUBURBS HAVE BEEN CAUSED

PRINCIPALLY BY DENIAL OF THE REGION AND

ATTEMPTS OF EACH MUNICIPALITY TO GO IT ALONE.

THEY HAVE WOOED THE OFFICE BUILDINGS AND

REFUSED THE HOUSING FOR OFFICE WORKERS.

IN THE LATE 1960'S, REGIONAL PLAN ASSOCIATION WARNED AGAINST THOSE POLICIES. LITTLE OF THAT WARNING WAS HEEDED. Now, THE THREE SUBURBAN COUNTIES THAT HAVE ATTRACTED THE MOST CORPORATE HEADQUARTERS HAVE EACH SEPARATELY COME BACK TO REGIONAL PLAN AND ASKED FOR HELP IN GETTING THEM OUT OF THE TRAFFIC AND HOUSING PROBLEMS.

THIS TIME, WE DECIDED TO DO THE PLANNING JOB

WE PLAYED BIG BEOTHE

DIFFERENTLY, IN THE 60'S WE IDENTIFIED THE

MID-1980'S, WE HAVE TOLD THESE THREE COUNTIES:

"You really know what has to be done; what you need is an exercise of will. Instead of coming into your county with our recommendations, we'll help you organize a citizen process so you come to your own conclusions." In each of these three counties, we have brought together hundreds of people in Task Forces and faced them with the facts and the options.

Newspapers have publicized the projects and distributed the two reports that have been completed thus far.

IN THE THIRD COUNTY, WE ARE JUST STARTING

OUT--WITH A STRONG STEERING COMMITTEE HEADED

BY THE CHAIRMAN OF XEROX'S EXPENSIVE COMMUNICATION

PETER McColough, AND MICHIELD OUR LOCAL

CONGRESSMAN, THE GOVERNOR'S TOP POLICY ADVISOR,

THE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIALS OF CITIES AND

TOWNS, AND OUTSTANDING CIVIC AND PROFESSIONAL

LEADERS.

IN THESE AND MANY OTHER WAYS, REGIONAL PLAN
ASSOCIATION IS TRYING TO MAKE THE REGION REAL
AND SATISFYING FOR OUR 19½ MILLION PEOPLE.
WE'RE TRYING TO HELP THEM SET GOALS THAT GO
BEYOND PROTECTING THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD VALUES TO
IMPROVE THE WIDER REGIONAL COMMUNITY IN WHICH
THEY ALSO LIVE. THAT, I THINK, IS THE BIGGEST
CHALLENGE OF REGIONAL PUBLIC-PRIVATE
PARTNERSHIPS TODAY.

IN SUM, I HAVE NO QUESTION THAT PARTNERSHIPS

HAVE BEEN GOOD FOR ALL THE PARTNERS--SO FAR.

BUT I'M NOT SO SURE THAT WE KNOW HOW FAR TO GO

AND HOW TO KEEP FROM OVER-INTRUDING OR

OVER-BURDENING THE CORPORATE INTEREST,

I AM CONVINCED THAT SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS COME
NOWHERE NEAR WHAT IS NEEDED, AND THAT
CORPORATE LEADERS MUST GO BEYOND PARTNERSHIPS
TO BECOME ADVOCATES IN THE PUBLIC ARENA ON
BEHALF OF OUR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

FINALLY, I REMAIN CONCERNED THAT REGIONAL
INTERESTS COULD BE OVERLOOKED IN FAVOR OF
PAROCHIAL INTERESTS. CORPORATIONS, UNLIKE
MOST PEOPLE OR INSTITUTIONS, UNDERSTAND THE
REGION AND WHY A REGIONAL PLAN SHOULD INFLUENCE
LOCAL PLANS. SO BUSINESS LEADERSHIP WILL BE
ESSENTIAL TO THE REGIONAL PLANNING PROCESS.

You, the members of Allegheny Conference, have been preeminent leaders in the realm of issues I have offered for your consideration this evening. It is a privilege to share these thoughts with you and I appreciate this opportunity to suggest some additional targets for your leadership.
